First, we have been able to get new sets of sacred vessels for weekend and Weekday Masses as suggested in the GIRM (General Instructions of Roman Missal). Thanks to all who donated to that fund and let us acquire those vessels that will be used at Assumption for a long time. That fund also allows us to buy new holy water font liners for you to bless yourself on the way in and out of church.

Second, this coming Saturday, July 17 at 11:00 AM, we'll celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the Consolata Missionary Sisters. The Sisters taught here at Assumption School and have ministered to the people of God in the USA and around the world. They sure have touched the lives of many people and continue to carry on Jesus' Good News throughout the world. Please come to celebrate this momentous event with them and send them your prayer, best wishes and financial support if possible. The Sisters need our support to help them continue their mission of evangelization.

**The Consolata Missionary Sisters Celebrate 100 years of life in Mission**

2010 is a very special year for us Consolata Missionary Sisters around the world and in the United States. It marks the Centennial Year of our Foundation, a time to remember...give thanks...and look with confidence to the future that God has for us. One hundred years ago, in the city of Turin, Italy, a quiet but courageous diocesan priest, whose heart embraced the Gospel and the world, Blessed Joseph Allamano, founded the Institute of the Consolata Sisters, having first founded, in 2001, the Consolata Missionaries, a community of Fathers and Brothers. Starting a community of women religious was not part of his plans; in fact, in an audience with Pope Pius X, Joseph Allamano told him he had no such vocation. But the Holy Father firmly said to him, "If you do not have such a vocation, I give it to you."

Thus, the seed of our missionary community was planted. Its roots sank deep into the spirit of faith in the unconditional love of God and the tender love of Our Lady Consolata that inspired our Founder to bring Jesus, our true Consolation, to the world. Through the years, the tree of our missionary family has extended its branches to different parts of the world and drawn new members from several countries in Europe, South and North America, and Africa. Our "Charism", that is our "call and gift", of Evangelization and Consolation has grown, developed, and has been enriched by each new encounter with diverse cultures, peoples, challenges, and situations. About 800 of our community members have already gone to the Lord after a life of service and dedication to the Gospel and to God's people.

Today, there are about 800 of us striving to live the motto, "...and they shall proclaim my glory among the nations" from the prophet Isaiah, 66:19. Wherever we are missioned, we share life, faith, and the Gospel of Jesus with all people. We seek to be a "presence" of hope and consolation in an exchange of gifts and experiences that incarnates the MISSION of Jesus in our world. In our varied ministries, we value a person-centered approach that honors the dignity and diversity of persons, communities, and cultural groups. We are attentive to the cries of the people for justice and peace and seek to empower them to voice their experiences of injustice and suffering toward change. We stand in solidarity with them and support their efforts.

We are happy to be Consolata Missionary Sisters wherever we are called to serve. We are grateful for God's ever-present faithfulness and for all of you who continue to share our journey in different ways, blessing us with the gift of your presence and friendship. Today, together, we praise God who, through these 100 years, has walked with us and has a future for all of us.

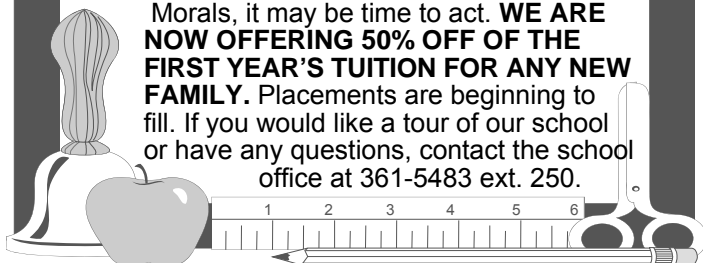
